Breast cancer is the most common cancer for women.

Annual screening mammograms beginning at age 40 reduces breast cancer mortality by nearly 40%.

Women with 1 or more risk factors may be at higher risk and screening mammography may start as early as 25 or 30 years of age.

A mammogram can usually find lumps 2-3 years before you or your health care provider can feel them.

Inform your doctor if you have a family history of breast cancer.

Monthly Routine



What To Look For

Check your breasts once a month for any unusual changes. Lumps, thickening, or any changes in size or shape.

Be Breast Aware

Your risk for breast cancer increases as you get older.

- Know what is normal for your breasts.
- Check your breasts monthly for changes.
- Report any changes immediately to your primary care provider.
- Consider yearly mammograms once you turn 40 (or earlier if you have a family history).
